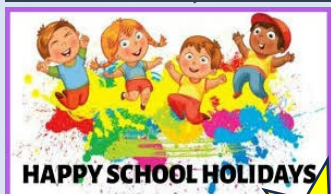

Cross Country

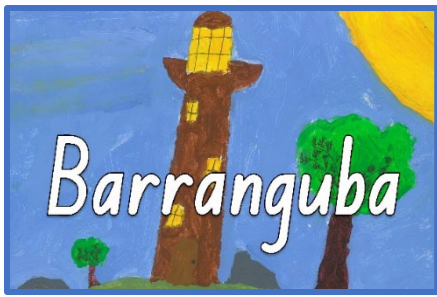

We take our hula very seriously! There are showdowns every play time!

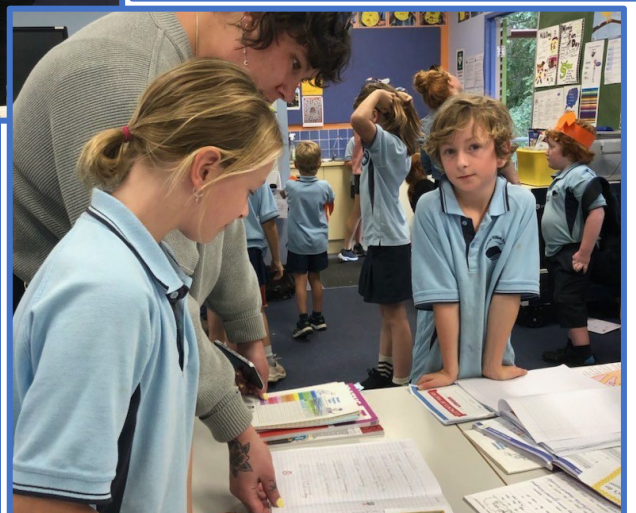
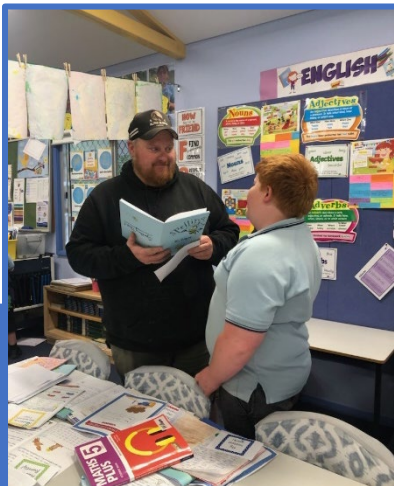

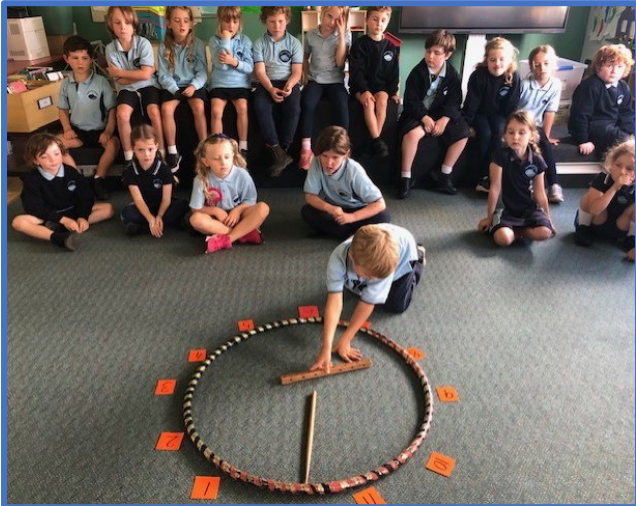




We love our class photo Amy- thank you. Lots of lovely comments about individual photos too.



Well done Willow who has worked hard to finish the Reading Eggs program. Go you!



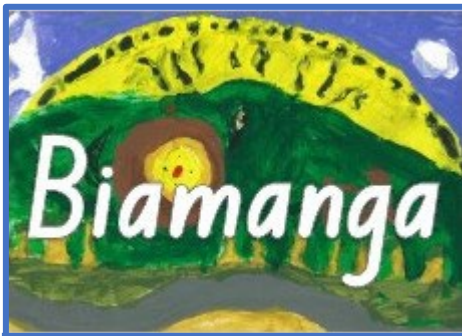
In maths we looked at time – o'clock and half past, and talked about the clocks we have in our homes.

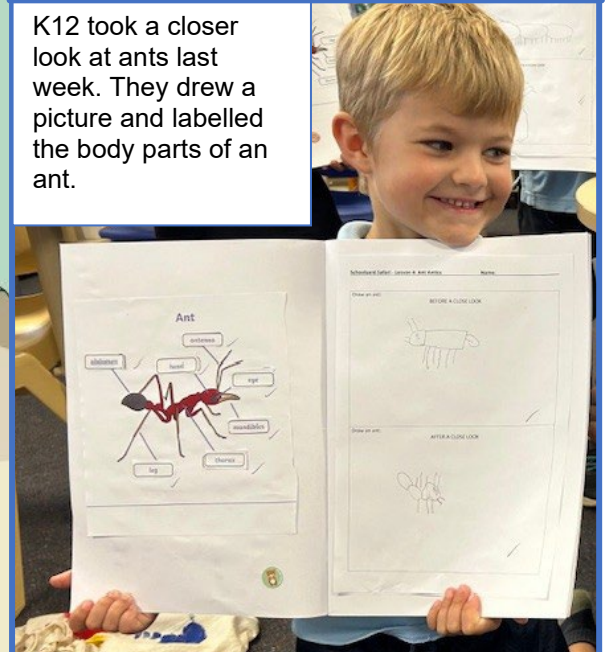

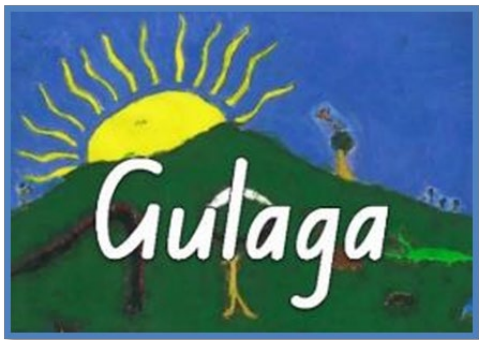


K12 took a closer look at ants last week. They drew a picture and labelled the body parts of an ant.
