Dear Parents and Students,

Thank you to parents Liane and Francois for today's delicious 'Special Lunch'.

Congratulations to our four public speakers – Archie, Jordy, Jamie and Zayd – who represented our school so well last Friday at The Gulaga Community of Schools Public Speaking Day. There were ten speakers in each division (representing Narooma, Bermagui, Cobargo, Central Tilba and Bodalla schools). Jordy and Zayd both finished fifth and Jamie and Archie both third in their divisions. Their combined effort saw our school finish as the runner up to Bermagui School. Each child should be very proud of their contribution.

Congratulations (again!) to Angela whose entry in the recent Tailwaggers competition was a winner. Angela's prize was delivered to the school this week.

Thank you to all parents who returned the Kids Matter and Scripture Surveys to the school. A detailed analysis of the Kids Matter survey is included in this Newsletter. I will be taking this data to Canberra tomorrow where I am attending the 'Getting Started' day. I will be accompanied by one of our Action Team members, Cindy Cunningham. This will be a planning day for our implementation of the program next year.

The Scripture survey was well returned by parents. Of the 30 replies, 12 were in favour of Scripture, while 18 were not. Although the majority were opposed to Scripture lessons, I am still required to provide a Scripture time for those in favour. Scripture is an entirely voluntary lesson, so no child will be forced to attend. I will therefore be making enquiries regarding Scripture for next year.

On Friday of this week I am required to attend a Far South Coast Principals' Meeting in Narooma. Mr Markham will teach the class in my absence both tomorrow and Friday.

This week the parent information for mathematics focuses on Year Five.

For the Primary Class, don't forget that we will be going to Canberra next Wednesday, November 25th. On Thursday of this week, I will be having a question and answer session with the Class to make sure they are ready. It should be a great three days in the national capital.

NUMBER – Fractions and Decimals; Patterns and Algebra – YEAR FIVE

Please note that the information presented in this Newsletter is of a general nature. For specific information related to your child, it is recommended that you speak with your child's teacher.

By the end of Year Five, a child should be able to –

Fractions and Decimals

- * Compare and order fractions with denominators 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 10, 12 and 100;
- * Express mixed numerals as improper fractions and vice versa;
- * Model and represent strategies to add and subtract fractions with the same denominator;
- * Apply the place value system to represent thousandths as decimals;
- * Compare, order and represent decimals with up to 3 decimal places.

Patterns and Algebra

- * Identify, continue, create and describe increasing and decreasing number patterns with fractions, decimals and whole numbers;
- * Find missing numbers in number sentences involving multiplication or division on one or both sides of the equals sign.
