NUMBER - Fractions and Decimals; Patterns and Algebra - YEAR SIX

Please note that the information presented in this Newsletter is of a general nature. For specific information related to your child, it is recommended that you speak with your child's teacher. By the end of Year Six, a child should be able to —

Fractions and Decimals

- * Represent, compare and order fractions with denominators 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 10, 12 and 100;
- * Determine, generate and record equivalent fractions;
- * Write fractions in their simplest form;
- * Add and subtract fractions, including mixed numerals, with the same or related denominators;
- * Multiply fractions by whole numbers;
- * Find a simple fraction of a quantity;
- * Use mental, written and calculator strategies to add and subtract decimals with up to 3 decimal places;
- * Use mental, written and calculator strategies to multiply decimals by 1 and 2 digit whole numbers;
- * Use mental, written and calculator strategies to divide decimals by 1 digit whole numbers;
- * Multiply and divide decimals by 10, 100 and 1 000;

- * Solve word problems involving fractions and decimals, including money problems;
- * Make connections between equivalent percentages, fractions and decimals;
- * Use mental, written and calculator strategies to calculate 10%, 25% and 50% of quantities, including as discounts.

Patterns and Algebra

- * Continue, create, record and describe geometric and number patterns in words;
- * Determine the rule for geometric and number patterns in words and use the rule to calculate values;

* Locate and record the coordinates of points in all four quadrants of the Cartesian plane.
