How parents and carers can help with decision-making

- Give children a choice between two options. This helps to make decisions manageable.
- Limit the number of choices to ones that are realistic for children to make (depending on their age and ability).
- Encourage children to give reasons for their choices. This teaches them to think through their decisions.
- Ask, 'Is that a good idea?' or 'Do you think that will work?' Instead of saying, 'This is what you should do,' ask 'What about this?' Asking encourages children to develop their own judgment.
- Listen with interest to children's explanations. Learning to explain their thinking helps children think better.
- Give children a role in family decisions, for example when planning activities or deciding on household jobs. This helps children learn how to make decisions that take others into account.

Learning Continuum – Statistics and Probability (Numeracy)

Please note that the information presented in this Newsletter is of a general nature. For specific information related to your child, it is recommended you speak with your child's teacher. By the end of Year Four, a child should be able to:

- Select, trial and refine methods for data collection, including survey questions and recording sheets
- Construct data displays, including tables, and column graphs and picture graphs of many-toone correspondence
- Evaluate the effectiveness of different displays
- Describe possible everyday events and order their chances of occurring
- Identify everyday events where one occurring cannot happen if the other happens
- Identify events where the chance of one occurring will not be affected by the occurrence of the other
