# Component 2 Social and Emotional Learning

#### Term 4 Week 9

#### What can get in the way of making good decisions

Having the skills for thinking through decisions makes a good decision more likely, but it doesn't guarantee one. Other things can get in the way. For example, strong feelings can cloud clear thinking. So when a child is frightened, angry or overwhelmed by strong feelings the chances of making a good decision are reduced. Having skills for managing feelings can help children to calm down and make better decisions.

Some children have impulsive temperaments and find learning to think through their behaviour a particular challenge. These children especially benefit from learning skills that help them to think before they act. Certain kinds of thinking can also interfere with good judgment. It is not uncommon in younger children in particular to be over-confident about their abilities and this can contribute to poor decisions at times. Being competitive can mean children want to prove themselves in front of others and so lead them to make rash decisions. Prejudice or hostility towards particular individuals and poor social skills also contribute to poor social decision-making.

#### Learning Continuum – Statistics and Probability (Numeracy)

Please note that the information presented in this Newsletter is of a general nature. For specific information related to your child, it is recommended you speak with your child's teacher. By the end of Year Six, a child should be able to:

- Interpret and create 2 way tables
- \* Interpret side by side column graphs
- \* Compare a range of data displays to determine the most appropriate displays for particular sets of data
- \* Interpret and critically evaluate data presented in digital media and elsewhere
- \* Compare observed frequencies in chance experiments with expected frequencie
- \* Represent probabilities using fractions, decimals and percentages
- \* Conduct chance experiments with both small and large numbers of trials

The tiger pounced.


