

Please contact the school if you *are* able to make it as we have limited numbers in the Library.



Primary Children's Holiday Workshops in January 2021

The Summer of 2020 will be one Jody Vassallo will never forget. She spent 6 weeks volunteering both on the fire ground as a member of the RFS and in Firecom at Moruya receiving 000 calls, dispatching trucks and equipment. Days were long, terrifying and pushed her to the limit. During that time she heard a story on the radio about wombats allowing other animals to shelter in their burrows. It was one of the very few feel good stories she heard that summer. We lost 1.25 billion animals in the fires that year, it was devasting and whenever Jody, in her RFS uniform came upon children they would ask her "Are you saving the animals?".

A percentage of book sales will be donated to Firesticks Alliance Indigenous Corporation - an Indigenous led network that aims to re-invigorate the use of cultural burning by facilitating cultural learning pathways to fire and land management. It is an initiative for Indigenous and non Indigenous people to look after Country, share their experiences and collectively explore ways to achieve their goals.
