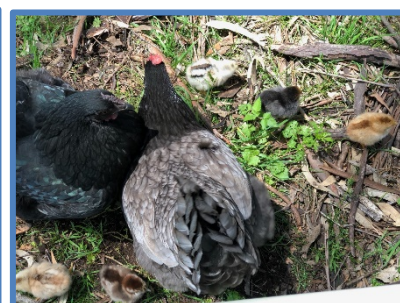
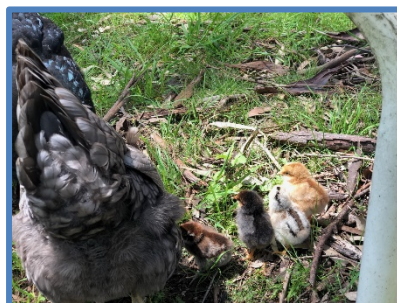
Welcome Back Everyone!

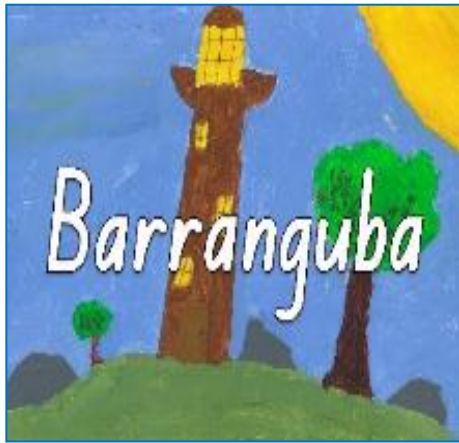

The sounds coming from the Music Room were music to our ears this week! Mr Fowler is very impressed with the progress made by some children who practised their music skills at home.

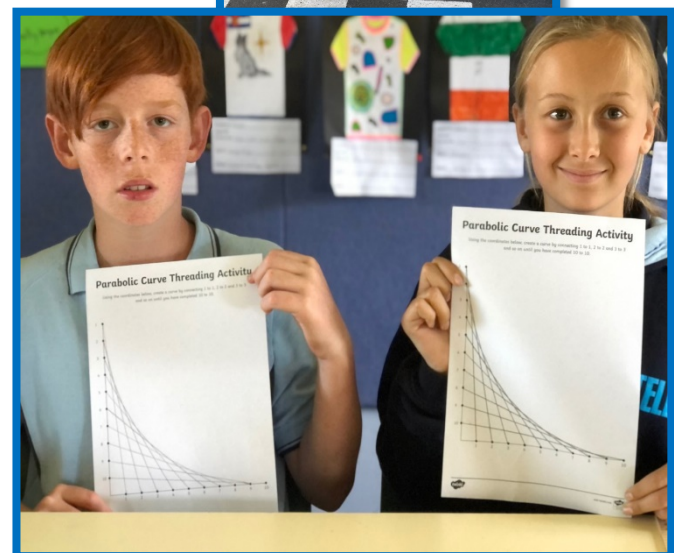


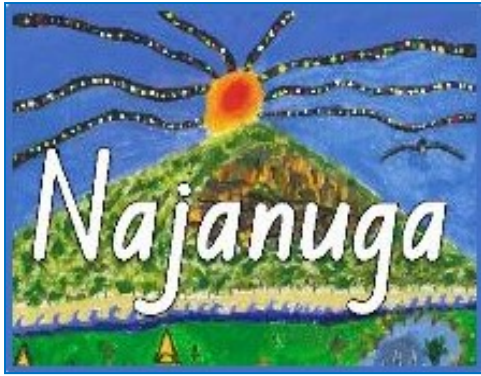
It was great to play a game again! A very competitive field on Monday, scoring three goals each. A rematch next week to determine who is on top!
