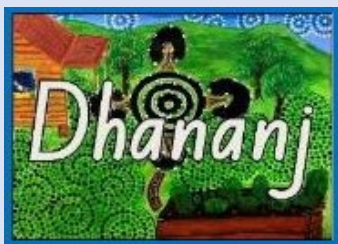

This small school is a busy one!

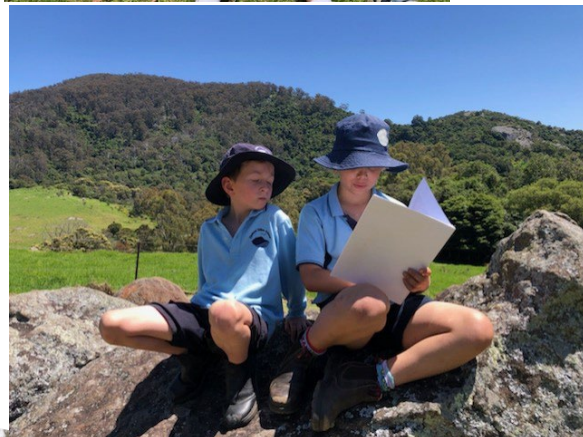

will remember forever.

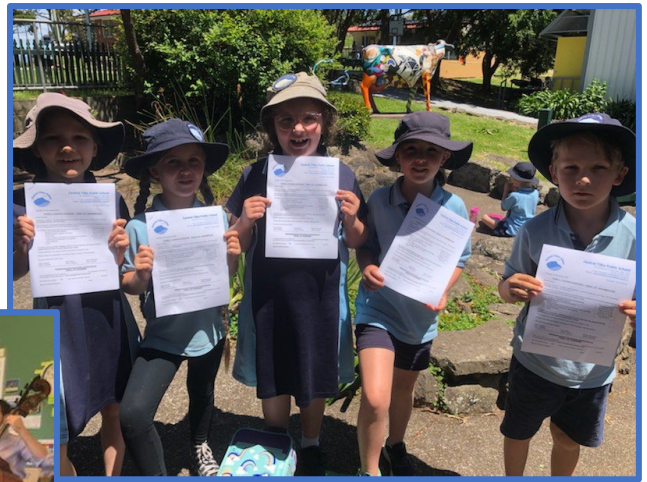
