# Fee-free birth certificates for vulnerable people born in NSW

The NSW Registry of Births Deaths and Marriages and Legal Aid NSW are working together to make fee-free birth certificates available to vulnerable people who were born in NSW and who experience significant barriers to obtaining a birth certificate. Our partnership is helping up to 700 vulnerable people access a birth certificate through a series of targeted events in regional and remote NSW until 30 June 2022.

## How can people access a birth certificate through this partnership?

People who are eligible to receive a fee-free birth certificate under this partnership will be identified at events organised through the Legal Aid NSW Cooperative Legal Service Delivery Program, and will receive assistance to apply for a birth certificate.

Legal Aid NSW will submit completed applications for birth certificates made by eligible people to the NSW Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages who will then issue a free birth certificate to the applicants. The Registry and Legal Aid NSW will work together to help applicants whose birth is not registered.

## What is the Legal Aid NSW Cooperative Legal Service Delivery Program (CLSD Program)?

The CLSD Program supports 12 regional justice partnerships across regional and remote NSW to meet the needs of vulnerable and disadvantaged people, improve coordination of legal services and extend regional capacity through cooperation.

Typically, CLSD Program partnerships include representatives from Legal Aid NSW, community legal centres, the Aboriginal Legal Service (NSW/ACT), courts and community service providers, as well as private lawyers.

## Where will these events be held?

Events are planned in targeted regional locations around NSW including Bourke, Brewarrina, Broken Hill, Coonamble, Forbes, Newcastle and Taree.

Representatives of Legal Aid NSW and other CLSD Program partners will assess event attendees' eligibility for a fee-free birth certificate, offer a law check-up to identify whether they have unmet legal needs, and make referrals to legal assistance services as needed.

Events will be promoted within local communities.

## Who is eligible?

People are eligible for a fee-free birth certificate under this partnership if they are experiencing economic hardship (for example, they receive Centrelink income support at the maximum rate, or have no income) and they:

- are, or have been, in out of home care
- are a victim of domestic or family violence
- have no or low literacy
- are homeless or at risk of homelessness
- are under the age of 18 and not employed or engaged in education
- have a mental illness or cognitive impairment, or
- are Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander.

A fee-free birth certificate is not available through this partnership if the person has received a fee-free birth certificate in the previous 12 months.

**Neptune's Necklace and Solider Crabs –** This is a unique experience to look at the many interesting and bizarre animals of the estuaries. At low tide join our guide as we take a closer look at the small creatures that live around the mangroves.

**Splash Amongst the Paddle Weed –** Join our marine NPWS guide and take a walk amongst the paddle weed. Take a look for creatures such as moon snails, sea hares, slugs, bubble shells and sand living fish. Why do these creatures live here.

**Dragons in the Forest –** Meet your Discovery Ranger for this beautiful 6km walk along a coastal lagoon system, with rock outcrops. A wide range of vegetation communities, ranging from rainforest through open forest, woodland, scrub, heath, dune and wetland. Try to spot the elusive water dragons.

- Bookings are essential for all tours. Spaces are limited, booking early is recommended.
- All tours must be paid for at time of booking.
- All prices include GST.
- Programs, times and prices may be subject to change.
- A park entry fee (in addition to tour cost) applies to some national parks and reserves when you access the park by vehicle.
- Extreme weather conditions such as bush fires and/or significant wet weather may result in NSW National Parks cancelling some programs.
- Refunds or activity transfers for prepaid activities only apply if NSW National Parks cancels due to unforeseen circumstance.
- Visitor Cancellations require 24hrs notice and incur 30% administration fee.
