
Term 3 Week 4



Unfortunately, it was Murringo's day. A huge effort Tilba- Congratulations!



Australia's Wild, Weird, Wonderful Weather book is in the spotlight this week as the Najanuga class have been reading through it to learn more about the weather. The 'Under a Cloud' page provided the class with helpful information on the different types of clouds and this assisted them to create their cloud charts in Science. The Stage 3 students are reading the novel Wonder by R J Palacio in Literacy this term. Kindness is the main theme in Wonder. It helps us realise that a small, simple act of kindness can make a big difference, and we have the ability to CHOOSE KIND.





In Science, the Najanuga students have become weather watchers as they learn about 'Weather in my World'. The students are using weather symbols to record what the weather is like each day.
