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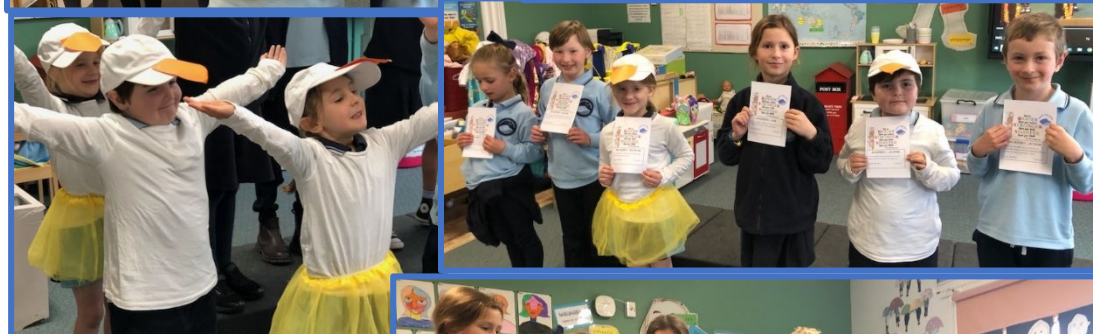
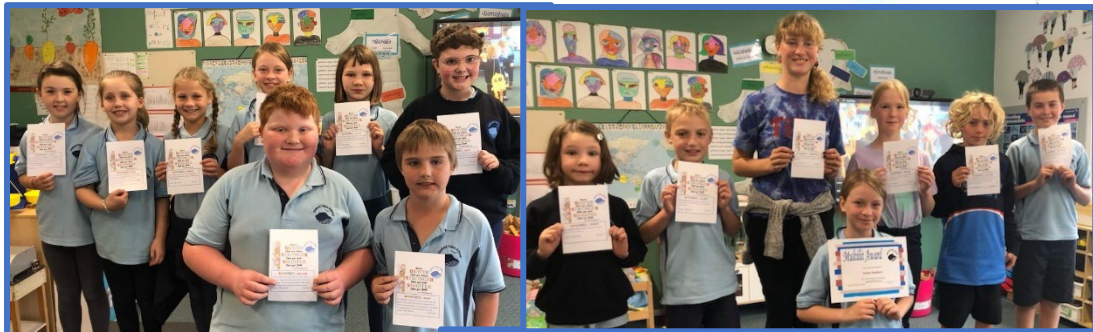

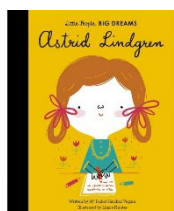


Book Week

Letting me go back in time.

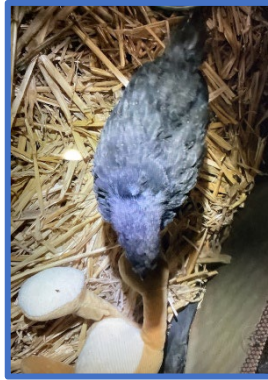

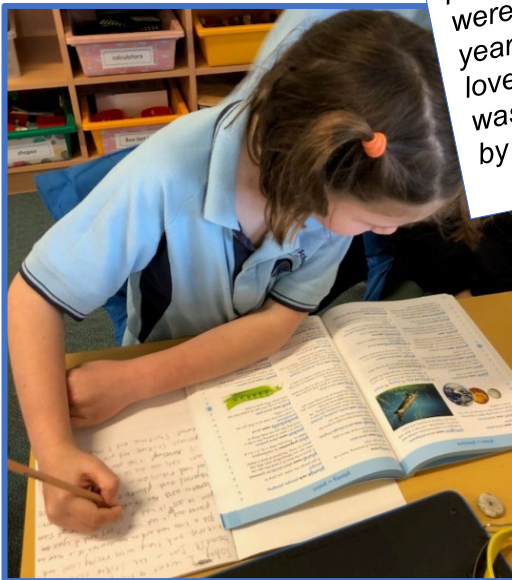


Quinn has worked hard to complete the Fast Phonics program- excellent work Quinn!

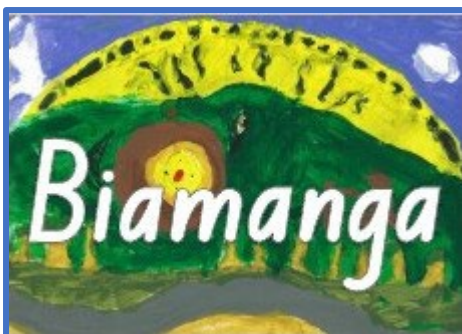


Here we are making our hedgehogs in paper craft. Making cones turned out to be much trickier than we expected.
