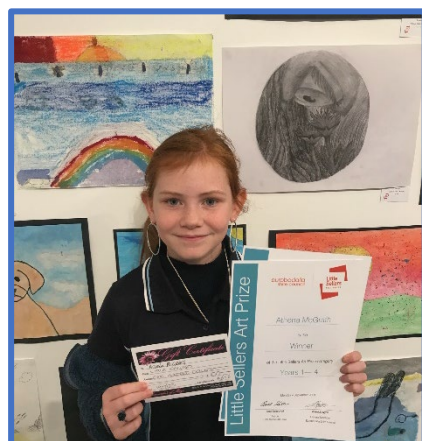

Karl Erik Iwar's clay sheep

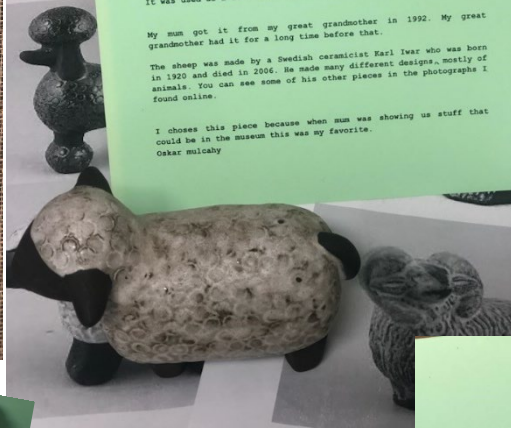
This is a ceramic sheep made in Sweden by Karl Erik Iwar

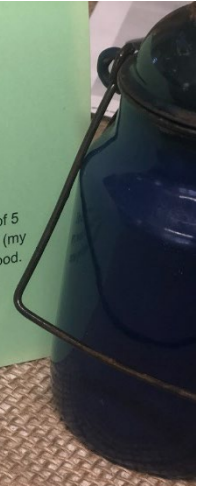
Enamel Billy Can

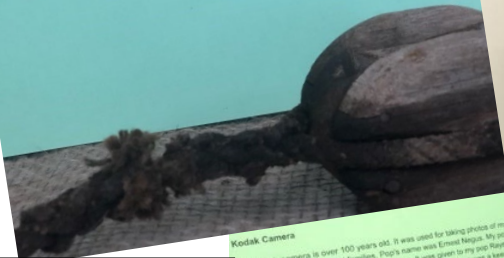


FISHING TRAWLER PULLEY

My family came to have it because when we were at the house with the original owner, she said to my brother Jack we could have anything we wanted from under the house. Jack picked a couple of things he liked and this is one of them.



Kodak Camera

The kodak camera is over 100 years old. It was used for taking photos of my great grandpa's family and other local families. Pop's name was Ernest Negus. My pop Raymond Negus has it now, and has had it for 40 years. It was given to my pop by Raymond Negus from my great grandpa Ernest Negus between 1910 and 1920 in the Tilba district. Ernest and he worked as a local photographer between 1910 and 1920 in the Tilba district. Ernest brought the kodak camera in because I don't think anyone would bring in a 100 year old camera. In today's money the camera would cost \$3000. Another unique thing about it is that it was passed down in my family. First it was Ernest Negus's then passed down to his son Eliza Negus when Ernest died in 1945. From Eliza Negus's then passed down to his son when Eliza died in 1972 which was when my pop was only 12.

Deed Of Apprenticeship paper

This is my Grandfather David Rainbow's Deed Of Apprenticeship contract papers. This means that he can become a fully fledged carpenter. It's 67 years old and it was used as a contract between a building company and a young person to be taught carpentry. We came to have it because my Nan's husband, David, was the upcoming apprentice.

The story behind my piece is that the apprenticeship papers were made in Birmingham U.K, for the joint council for the building industry. And it's my Grandfather's, he had it 67 years ago, then became an apprentice carpenter from signing the papers.

Apprenticeship contracts lasted four years, then they were fully fledged carpenters and joiners.

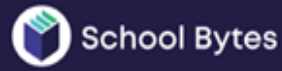
A Sunny Day
